

MEDICO DIES, FAMILY TO DONATE ORGANS

PG medical student Kanike Priyanka (28), who sustained critical head injuries when a car allegedly driven by an inebriated youth hit her two-wheeler in the city on August 3, died on Friday night while undergoing treatment at a hospital in Hyderabad. Priyanka's family has agreed to donate her organs, who was declared brain-dead.

Priyanka, a native of El-lanpur in Jogulamba Gadwal district of Telangana, was a meritorious student. She completed her MBBS at Kur-nool Government Medical College, and joined GSL Medical College for a post-graduate course in Dermatology in February this year.

The two accused who were



arrested in the drunk drive case, were remanded to 14-day judicial custody, and lodged in Rajamahendravaram Central Prison. Prakash Nagar police are investigating the case.

Ensure justice to medico's family: Women's panel chairperson to EG police

ANDHRA Pradesh Women's Commission Chairperson Rayapati Sailaja on Saturday expressed grief over the death of medico Priyanka in a hit-and-run case in Rajamahendravaram, and directed the East Godavari district SP to take stringent action against the two accused who indulged in a drunk driving. She urged the police to ensure justice to the family of Priyanka at the earliest.

The Women's Commission Chairperson condemned the false reports being circulated on social media pertaining to the hit-and-run case. She appealed to the public and social media users not to spread unverified information that could cause further distress to Priyanka's family.

She sought details of the hit-and-run case from the SP, and stressed the need for a thorough investigation to establish the circumstances that led to the incident.

The police should ensure that the accused face stringent punishment in accordance with law without any delay in the case trial, she said. She assured that the Women's Commission would extend all necessary support to the family of medico.

Low-pressure area unlikely to impact AP

A low-pressure area has formed under the influence of a cyclonic circulation over Southwest Bengal and adjoining areas of North Odisha.

According to the Andhra Pradesh State Disaster Management Authority (APSDMA), the weather system is likely to have only a limited impact on AP. On Sunday, isolated light to moderate rainfall is expected in Parvathipuram Manyam and Alluri Sitarama Raju districts.

The remaining districts of North Andhra are likely to receive scattered light rainfall. The weather system may bring some cloud cover and rainfall activity over parts of the north coastal region, while no major impact has been forecast for other parts of the State.

The APSDMA advised people to remain alert to local weather updates and follow advisories issued by the disaster management and meteorological agencies.

50K ton Araku Coffee target by '47

Coffee Board plans to introduce 'Indicof' and export it to global markets later this year

FROM a modest beginning of 15 tonnes of coffee production five decades ago, Araku Valley has grown into one of India's internationally recognised coffee-growing regions, now producing around 15,000 tonnes annually.

As the Regional Coffee Research Station (RCRS) in RV Nagar of Alluri Sitarama Raju district celebrates 50 years of coffee cultivation, it has set an ambitious target of increasing production to 50,000 tonnes by 2047 through scientific farming, quality improvement and sustainable cultivation practices.

Coffee Board Chairperson MJ Dinesh said the focus would be on improving productivity and quality rather than merely expanding the area under cultivation, with tribal farmers remaining at the centre of the strategy. "We want to take Araku coffee to the next level globally. Araku is already recognised internationally, but we are introducing 'Indicof', a



quality standard for Indian coffee, to establish a distinct global identity for our green coffee exports," Dinesh said.

The Coffee Board plans to introduce a three-tier quality classification under the Indicof initiative and begin exports to global markets later this year.

To improve farmers' incomes, the Coffee Board is preparing a nutri-organic package of practices for organic coffee growers in Araku, parts of Odisha and the Northeast.

According to Dinesh, poor soil nutrition and low pH levels are affecting productivity in many plantations. The new package will recommend scientific soil management, includ-

ing the use of granulated lime to improve soil health, increase yield and enhance cup quality.

"Many farmers currently harvest around 70 kg. Our objective is to significantly improve productivity from existing plantations so that their incomes increase without necessarily expanding the cultivated area," he noted.

The package of practices will be released during the Coffee Board's golden jubilee celebrations in Araku. Addressing the impact of climate change, Dinesh stressed that the Coffee Board is encouraging multi-crop and biodiversity-based farming instead of monoculture plantations. "Farmers are

being advised to introduce fruit-bearing and other suitable shade trees to improve soil health, regulate temperature and create additional income sources. Biodiversity would also strengthen Araku's positioning as a producer of sustainably grown and shade-grown coffee in international markets," he elaborated.

On exports, Dinesh said Brazil remained India's biggest competitor in Arabica coffee, while Vietnam dominated the Robusta segment. "However, the recent India-UK trade agreement, which provides zero tariff access for Indian coffee, offers a significant opportunity to expand exports, particularly in the UK market," he remarked.

He added that the Coffee Board would continue working with the Andhra Pradesh government to promote scientific cultivation practices, improve quality and strengthen market linkages so that the benefits of higher productivity and premium pricing reach tribal coffee growers in Eastern Ghats.

Art should reach people: Pemmasani

GOVT INDIFFERENT TO EMPLOYEE DEMANDS: AP JAC

THE AP JAC Amaravati has expressed strong dissatisfaction over the State government's delay in taking decisions on long-pending issues concerning government employees, despite holding detailed discussions with employee associations.

Leaders of the AP JAC Amaravati held a meeting at Revenue Bhavan in Vijayawada on Satur-

day to discuss employees' problems and the government's approach towards their demands.

Speaking on the occasion, AP JAC Amaravati chairman Bopparaju Venkateswarlu, secretary general Palishetty Damodara Rao said the government's decision to invite employee representatives for talks when the AP JAC Amaravati launched its agitation was initially viewed as a positive development.

However, they said the Cabi-

net Sub-Committee held extensive discussions with employee associations on July 22, but the government had not announced a single decision on the issues discussed. This had resulted in growing frustration and dissatisfaction among employees, they said.

The leaders clarified that employees were not making any fresh or unreasonable demands and they were only seeking im-

plementation of the assurances given by the coalition government in its election manifesto.

They also criticised the employee-related references in the white paper on the State's financial position released on August 4, alleging that they could mislead the public about the actual situation concerning government staff.

Recalling several assurances made by the coalition govern-

ment during the elections, including implementation of a better Pay Revision Commission (PRC), payment of pending allowances, announcement of Interim Relief (IR) after assuming office, and reconsideration of the CPS/GPS pension systems to arrive at an acceptable solution, the AP JAC leaders said though more than two years had passed since the NDA government assumed office, there was still no clarity on several issues.
